- B. Only U.S. Marshals, OR their appointed Deputies (Only One Seat per Club); and CFDA Executives, and/or their appointees are allowed a seat at the Marshal Muster Round Table, others may observe this meeting, subject to space limitations.
- C. Quick Cal, Director of CFDA, is the Moderator of this meeting, and will conduct this meeting in a Round Table Discussion Format.
- D. For the sake of conducting a productive and time effective meeting, the Moderator will recognize individual speakers, each speaker will have the floor and have sufficient time to make their point. Please keep comments to the point and upon the specific agenda item being discussed. Sometimes topics will be directed to go "Around the Table" by the Moderator to form a consensus of the group. If you have a valid point to add to the topic that hasn't been made previously, please feel free to comment. If you would just like to show support for a previously stated point, then pledge your support one way or another. Please avoid repetitious remarks.
- E. The Moderator may from time to time call for a Straw Pole Vote, to determine if a general consensus has been established. Any votes taken at the Marshal's Muster are advisory in nature to the Executives of CFDA, except where indicated by the words "Action or Possible Action" on the agenda, all other decisions and all interpretations are reserved by CFDA Management.

Some feel that there is a conflict in the Gunslinger's Guidelines 8th Edition.

Page 15. GUNS states, "The exterior parts of the revolver must match factory stock contours and made of original type material: i.e. hammers must not be bent in anyway, no trigger shoes, no aluminum/titanium barrels or cylinders, no skeletonizing, no modifications to the trigger guard, or grip frame, etc."

TUNING ACTIONS, "Cylinder notches may be deepened and cleaned to fit the bolt, lead-in grooves may be modified as needed to improve reliability."

Issue: There have been some Ruger Vaqueros that have had the cylinder lead-in grooves extended almost to the previous cylinder notches. Ruger bolts are factory designed to drop almost immediately after clearing the previous cylinder notch.

Position #1. Some members have stated that this has been done by a gunsmith to improve reliability.

Position #2. Some feel that this is an external modification to a gun part and could be considered skeletonizing.

Special Item Note: CFDA Management has decided that this issue will be decided by a binding vote of the U.S. Marshals present at this meeting.
