What a year we've had so far with so many CFDA Titles already occurring. The 2024 FGA is in the books, which also ended the 2024 Top Gun of the Year Points Season. But, the 2025 Top Gun Points started again with the Louisiana State the first weekend in August and is really picking up pace in September with the Idaho State, Kentucky State, South Dakota State, High Plains Territorial, Kansas State, Nebraska State and Great Plains Territorial. Then, in October with our Arizona State Championship.

I know it was a bit confusing for some with having the Top Gun of the Year Points ending just past the middle of the calendar year. However, with the date change of FGA we had to adapt. I also know that some folks didn't like FGA dates changing either, but this was necessary to extend a consistent and continuing use of the 3C Arena. We now have the 3rd weekend in July scheduled for 2025, '26, and '27. I really do believe that our members who come in support of CFDA's Signature Event each year have grown to appreciate this fantastic facility.

FGA

Congratulations to everyone who participated in the many competitive opportunities we had whether the Category Championships, Side Matches, Main Match, Second Chance, or Bracket Matches, you all had plenty of shooting to do. The complete results have been posted both on Facebook and our CFDA Website.

Of Course, special congratulations to both Oregon Ranger & Dead Eye Daisy, they both have won two in a row, with this being Oregon Ranger's unprecedented 8th CFDA Fastest Gun Alive - World Championship! We'll have the complete article in the next issue of the Gunslinger's Gazette!

Top Gun of the Year

We have two new Top Gun Champions this year, Saltwater Cowboy (FL) and Shell Shock (TX)! Saltwater Cowboy is the first person from our Eastern Territory to win CFDA's Top Gun of the Year. Shell Shock joined Tank as the only Junior Shooters to win Top Gun of the Year, Tank accomplished it in 2021 at the age of 17, Shell Shock is 16. Please see interviews with each of them in the next Gunslinger's Gazette.

2024 Marshal's Muster

It's interesting each year, when the Marshal's Muster Agenda is published, some of the comments that make their way back to me, either through word of mouth or social media. Just because an agenda item is proposed by a U.S. Marshal doesn't mean it's going to happen.

Each year, I'm glad to say, that I find a rather conservative group sitting around the conference table. Not that they are opposed to voting to make necessary adjustments and changes, but there better be a damned good reason to do it! The first thing I do is ask that no one comes in that room with their mind completely made up how they are going to vote on any agenda item, because they should take into consideration the round table discussion before making their final decision. Anyone who has been in this room has learned that there's a lot of experience sitting around that table and someone just might make a mind changing point during any of our discussions.

This is a great process and I can understand why some clubs, especially in the Eastern U.S. might feel left out if they cannot attend. We had an agenda item last year about turning these things into Zoom Meetings, but with a group this size, attempting to have a meaningful discussion with a Zoom Meeting would, in my opinion, be a disaster. As it is, to get this meeting done in the allotted time is a challenge. After all, almost everyone in the room are friends and conversations can wander off topic very quickly. I try to do my best to keep the meeting moving and to the point, by listening carefully and moving on to the next person or point efficiently. Most have been happy with the flow of the meeting, a few have stated otherwise, and I respect that.

The two main accomplishments this year were concerning Holsters & Range Master Training. I recommend every member download and read the 2024 Marshal's Muster Minutes.

Holsters

The subject of damaged holsters has festered for years. As our sport got faster, some members pushing for ultimate speed have a tendency to shoot the front of their holster, then attempt to patch it up. By over a 2-1 margin the U.S. Marshals agreed that a holster can never really be repaired back to its natural form. However, they did agree that if you attempted to do it, you must use period correct materials including Leather & Rawhide, using a needle and thread. No modern glues or fillers can be used.

They also approved that holsters that have been repaired in a non-acceptable manner should not be approved by Range Masters at an Equipment Check before an event. However, if a shooter damages their holster during the course of a contest, they shall have the option to either the replace the damaged holster or temporarily repair it, before the next round is fired. A replaced holster must pass another Equipment Check. A temporarily repaired holster must be brought up to compliance standards for both safety and rules, and approved by an official. The approval for a repaired holster expires at the end of the competition.

The U.S. Marshals also approved and CFDA Management agrees that we should mark holsters during Equipment Checks as well as guns. Some of the suggested methods of holster marking included zip ties, stickers, yarn, or

concert/hospital bracelets. No clear decision was made on exactly what type of marking, but we trust that different matches will try different methods and perhaps CFDA should adopt a standard. The next several months will be a testing period and perhaps at next year's Marshal Muster a preferred method will be adopted. In the meantime, we ask that contest Hosts start marking and trying new ideas.

Range Master Training

Some members have suggested extending Range Master Qualification beyond the current 2-year time-period. The fact is, that Range Masters are listed and considered still qualified for an entire year after they expire, so it is actually 3-years. We have also drastically simplified the renewal process into a one-page Continuing Education Training Log. Our main goal is simply to keep Range Masters active and informed on current Range Master procedures.

There was a policy wherein the initial Instructor was only (Part One) of the qualification process. (Part Two) was having an additional Instructor to observe a RM Candidate at a titled championship, before the final sign-off. It is a well-known fact that we have some rather experienced members who for one reason or another have not either taken training or renewed as Range Masters.

The above issue was discussed at the Marshal's Muster and then at the Annual Regulator Posse Meeting that followed. Here are the following actions that were taken...

- 1. RM Candidates, Renewing, or expired RMs still must review the latest edition of the RO Course and take training as needed from a Regulator or Range Master Instructor.
- 2. Any Regulator or RM Instructor that is confident that the Range Master they trained or observed is competent in the ability to safely and efficiently run a CFDA Range, can sign-off the application or renewal document, instantly promoting them to Qualified Range Master. It is the responsibility of the newly Qualified Range Master to submit their appropriate and signed forms to the Range Master General, or their name will not appear on the Official Range Master List that is updated monthly at CowboyFastDraw.com.
- 3. If there is a shortage of Qualified Range Masters. A Match Director of a CFDA Titled Championship may temporarily appoint registered CFDA members as Range Masters, if they are confident in their ability to safely act in the capacity of a Range Master.

I look forward to seeing you all at a Cowboy Fast Draw contest soon.

2024 WESTERN TERRITORIAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Thursday June 12th, we started The Western Territorial Championship with a little warm up, shooting warm up that is because it was plenty HOT outside! Hot enough that we brought the Jackpot indoors with air conditioning.

At high noon, shots were fired for the ladies and they battled through 11 rounds – last man standing format, 3X – Nevada 8. 18 ladies in this group and three of them were Annie Oakley. Little J and Pickle (AO), and Annie B Goode all had 2Xs going into a bye in round 10. Annie B Goode hits her target .553 just a little faster than Little Js .569 leaving the sisters to battle. Pickle hits every time her older sister, Little J does, just not as fast. Now Annie B Goode and Little J take 4 shots to have a winner and it's Annie B Goode. Congratulations ladies!

Now, on to the men's Jackpot who had 43 shooters. They shot through 13 rounds and must have watched the ladies shooting because at round 12, the last three shooters also had 2xs each. Crosswired won the bye round leaving Cowboy Up and Witlock. After 5 shots, Witlock prevails. Now down to Witlock and Crosswired, who take 5 shots to determine Witlock the winner. Congratulations men!!

Now bright-eyed and bushy tailed, 7am starts the Western Territorial Championship shooters meeting to get the One-Day 4X - Magnificent 7 Championship rollin'.

We had lots of shooting through the day and 4 ranges moving steady with Wild Shot in the scoring room. At the end of a hot day, we started the Finals with our Youth Fabulous 5. The Youth seeding going in was 1st Little J, 2nd Night Hawk, 3rd Dink, 4th Sniper, and 5th Pickle. Each of these kids got shuffled in the lineup. It came down to Sniper and Little J with one X each but it was Sniper from Idaho, hitting 1-2-3 to shoot out Little J from California, winning The Western Territorial Youth Championship! Congratulations to all the youth shooters!

Our Top 3 Jr. Shooters were placed within the standings. Congratulations to all our Jr. Shooters! 1^{st} Shell Shock, $TX - 2^{nd}$ Ry-Dog Jones, $CA - 3^{rd}$ Anytime Kid, CA

Up next, the ladies Magnificent 7. The seeding order going in was 1st Huckleberry Honey, 2nd Honey Bucket, 3rd Shell Shock, 4th

Lefty Lipscomb, 5th Holli Day, 6th Kiss-N-Tell, and 7th Prairie Rose. Each of these ladies also changed their order during the finals. First up, our 6th and 7th seeds, Kiss-N-Tell and Prairie Rose. After 4 shots Prairie Rose comes out the winner of that round to take on our 5th seed, Holli Day. This time it is Holli Day who wins the round against Prairie Rose. So now it's Lefty Lipscomb, our 4th seed who takes on Holli Day. After 6 shots, Lefty Lipscomb takes that round while Prairie Rose and Kiss-N-Tell shoot it out for 7th place. 5 shots determine it's Kiss-N-Tell who takes 7th place. Lefty Lipscomb now takes on the 3rd seed, Shell Shock who is having a hard time finding the target. Lefty Lipscomb wins that round while on lanes 3 & 4 Holli Day and Prairie Rose are shooting to determine 6th place. After 4 shots, Prairie Rose's fate is determined to be 6th place. Lefty Lipscomb now takes on the 2nd seed, Honey Bucket. Lefty Lipscomb is warmed up and hits 1-2-3 to take the win against Honey Bucket. Over on lanes 3 & 4, we have Holli Day and Shell Shock. 3 winning hits against 2, Holli Day takes another win, placing Shell Shock in 5th place. Now Lefty Lipscomb takes on the 2nd seed, Huckleberry Honey. Huckleberry Honey hits 1-2-3 and wins the round to sit in the catbird seat. Over on lanes 3 & 4, Honey Bucket and Holli Day are having trouble finding the target. Mind you, this was Holli Days 5th round out in the hot sun, and it was HOT! Its Honey Bucket who wins the round, 3 to 2 and Holli Day places 4th and heads over to the shade. Now we have Lefty Lipscomb and Honey Bucket to settle on 3rd place. Honey Bucket gives Lefty Lipscomb some payback and hits 1-2-3 winning the round and Lefty Lipscomb takes 3rd place. On to determine the winner.... Honey Bucket has 1X, while Huckleberry Honey is clean. After 4 shots Honey Bucket wins the round. Now they are both with 1X. After 5 shots, 2 to 3, it's Honey Bucket who wins, and Huckleberry Honey takes 2nd place. The ladies congratulated each other and give an extended hug and shed a tear as this was Honey Buckets 1st Championship WIN! Honey Bucket is our Ladies Western Territorial Champion! Congratulations to all the ladies!

On to the men's Magnificent 7 seeding, we have 1st Oregon Ranger, 2nd Cowboy Up, 3rd Short Keg, 4th Tank, 5th Old Drifter, 6th Red Ryder, and 7th Turd Herder. Dang, only two changed in this lineup, but this is how it went...

First up on lanes 1 & 2 come Red Ryder and Turd Herder. The hits are 2 to 3, and Turd Herder takes the first win. Out comes Old Drifter to challenge Turd Herder and this time it's Old Drifter who takes the win. Old Drifter then takes on the 4th seed, Tank. 3 to 2, Old drifter wins the round again. Over on lanes 3 & 4, 1 to 3 Turd Herder wins again, and Red Ryder takes 7th place. Our 3rd seed Short Keg comes out and takes on Old Drifter. 3 to 2, its Short Keg who wins the round. Over in the placement lanes it's Turd Herder and Tank who go 0 to 3 for the win and Turd Herder takes 6th place. Cowboy Up steps up to the line to take on Short Keg. After 4 shots, 3 to 1 Cowboy Up wins his first round. On lanes 3 & 4, Old Drifter and Tank go 0 to 3 and the win goes to Tank, while Old Drifter takes 5th place. Oregon Ranger takes lane 2, leaving Cowboy Up on lane 1. This round goes 1 to 3, putting Oregon Ranger in the catbird seat. Over in the placement lanes are Tank and Short Keg. The score is 2 to 3 after 5 shots, Short Keg wins the round and Tank is 4th place. Now to determine 3rd place. Center stage we have Cowboy Up and Short Keg. Short Keg not missing a shot, and only 4 shots in we have 3 faster hits from Cowboy Up. Short Keg takes 3rd place. Now the final two shooters, Oregon Ranger and Cowboy Up. Oregon Ranger is clean and Cowboy Up has 1X. This round only goes 4 shots. Cowboy Up gets 1 hit on the target but Oregon Ranger comes back with 3 to take the round and the championship. Cowboy Up takes 2nd place and Oregon Ranger is our Men's Western Territorial Champion! Congratulations to all the men!

After the finals, we headed indoors to cool off and awards were given out. Old Drifter started up the Poker Game over in Ol Buck'rs Range just after Lefty Lipscomb and friends provided a potluck in Range A.

The Western Territorial Championship hosted 131 shooters. 10 youth, 43 ladies, and 78 men. We would like to give a huge THANK YOU to the Bangor 4-H Club for providing a snack bar to our shooters throughout the long shooting weekend! Thank you to all who helped in any way. It takes so much work to organize and run any shoot and there are so many who pitch in without even being asked, we — The Sundowners, appreciate you! These two had a really hard time finding the target (I can say that because I was one of them). But it was Shell Shock who finally won the first round 1-3. Next up, Shell Shock took on Deadeye Dixie, winning 3-0. Ricochet Rose walks to the line and moves Shell Shock from lane 1, but that didn't work as that round went to Shell Shock 0-3. Ry Dog Jones now must try against the 4th seed Tank, but it's Tank who wins against Ry Dog Jones 3-0. Over on the placement lanes its Master Gunfighter and Crosswired who

> shoot 5 shots down range to determine Master Gunfighter bows out at 7th place. Witlock walks out to the line taking Tanks winning lane, but it doesn't work. Tank won this round 3-1. On the placement lanes Crosswired and Ry Dog Jones take 6 shots to find Ry Dog Jones will stay and play 3-1 while Crosswired takes 6th place. Now our 2nd seed Yosemite Sean will try his hand dealing with Tank but is still on a roll winning another round 3-1. On the placement

The score goes 2-2 but it's Tank who gets the final hit and takes the round 3-2 placing Witlock in 3rd place. Now for the final two men. Tank has 1X, given to him by Oregon Ranger and Oregon Ranger is clean. Tank wins the round 3-2, and now they are both dirty with an X each. They switch lanes to see who will take the championship. Four shots down range, the score was 3-1 and Tank takes 2nd place and Oregon Ranger wins another U.S. National Championship! Congratulations to all the men, fantastic shooting!



ALOTTA LEAD'S FAMILY FAVORITE RECIPES

Fall & football......what better time to bring out the snack foods & try out new grub for the hungry crowd. Here's one that's super easy to prepare & you can make a ton at once & actually has very few ingredients! What could be better! You can fill these "cups" with a lot of different ingredients, but this is a "family favorite" for sure...anything BBQ for game day!

"Game Day BBO Biscuit Cups"

½ Cup Celery - finely diced

34 Cup Green Bell Pepper diced

3/4 Cup Sweet Onion Finely diced

1 Cup of Your Favorite BBQ Sauce

1 ½ Cup of Colby-Jack Grated Cheese- or your favorite (Optional)

2 Lbs Ground Chuck Beef

2-Cans Flakey Biscuits -10 count cans

1 Tablespoon Brown sugar- Optional

Muffin Tin Regular Size

Heat Oven according to instructions on the biscuit can-usually 400 degrees.

In a large skillet, cook the ground beef -break up into a crumble, add onions, bells & celery until beef is cooked completely. Drain fat completely. Add BBQ sauce to meat mixture, (add brown sugar at this time which is optional, if you like a sweeter BBQ sauce,) stir and cook for about 5 minutes. Slow it down to a low simmer while you get the biscuits ready.

Grease the bottom and sides of the muffin tin really well. Separate the biscuits into 20 rounds. Put two together, roll them out to make approximately a 5" circle. You now have 10 dough circles, press each dough circle into a muffin cup and all the way up the side. Fill with the beef mixture, continue until you have filled all 10 muffin cups, then pop in the oven for 10 minutes (until the biscuit part looks golden brown). Take out of the oven & now go ahead & sprinkle with cheese - bake for another 1-2 min. & they're ready to go! Try a small dollop of Sour Cream on top instead of cheese or sprinkle a few finely chopped tamed jalapeños on top or both! So good!! FYI...You can make these any size you want! Use Jumbo muffin tins for more of a meal with a salad, or smaller ones for more of an appetizer size snack. The regular size tin makes the perfect size "Game Day" snack! Give it a try this season!

But there were many applications that said, "referred by a friend." For clubs to get credit for new members, the club's name MUST be listed on the application. What I have found that works well is printing an application from the website (www.cowboyfastdraw.com), writing your club name in, then make copies. Once they fill it out. Just pop it in the mail and I'll take it from there. Those same applications can also be used for membership renewals.

Memberships are already coming in. We already have 8 clubs with new members. So, you're off to a great start. Let's really bring those members in and show them what the CFDA Family is all about.



Please allow up to 2 weeks for CFDA to prepare your firearm for shipping.

The buyer is responsible to pay all transfer fees, background checks directly to their FFL Dealer of choice.

All Firearm Sales Are Final. In the unlikely event that your FFL Dealer cannot process your transfer paperwork due to a background check that did not pass. The buyer may contact our office and request a return of the firearm and a refund of the sale. The gun must be returned to CFDA only by the FFL Dealer that it was originally sent to, in the original condition. THE GUNS

Single-action revolvers, factory chambered for .45 Colt caliber, with non-adjustable rear sights such as: SAA Colt, Colt Bisley, 1858 Remington conversions, 1875 Remington, S&W Schofield and faithful reproductions thereof, plus most Ruger Vaquero models. The external parts of the revolver must match factory stock contours and made of original type material: i.e. hammers must not be bent in any way. No trigger shoes, no mods to the trigger guard or grip frame, etc. Front sights are optional and barrels must be a minimum length of 4-1/2", except in the Shootist Category (7-1/2"). Hammer knurling may be smoothed.

THE HOLSTERS & GUN BELTS

1800's-style Mexican Loop, Slim Jim, and California Pattern holsters or leather rawhide construction. The over the belt-style holster will be worn on the side of the leg only. No cross-draw, shoulder, buscadero, contemporary Hollywood or steel lined holsters are allowed.

Ammunition

95% of ammunition used in Cowboy Fast Draw is .45 colt casings that are specially modified to accept 209 shotgun primers and no gun powder. Velocities reach about 650 fps. Only in major competitions Cowboy Fast Draw Cartridges are used, they must be loaded by CFDA approved reloaders.

TARGETS (THREE STANDARD TARGETS)

17-3/16" Round Plate - 47" Center Height (Start Light in Center) 24" Round Plate - 50" Center Height (Start Light in Center) Balloon-Disc - Rarely Used in Championship Finals - See Specs

White lithium grease is applied to target plates, to track all wax bullet hits.

COMPETITION TIMERS

Digital timers must time to the thousandth of a second. Sanctioned contests must use target with impact sensors.

SHOOTING STYLE

Most folks use a thumb-cocking method, but fanning is allowed. Trigger finger must be out of the trigger guard. If used to cock the hammer the off-hand must not be placed in front of the body before the start light comes on.

CONTESTS

Contests are shot elimination style, best 2 out of 3, or 3 out of 5 shots per round. The standard contest is luck of the draw man vs. man elimination.

1800's period clothing is strongly recommended. Western cowboy, including working cowboy clothing is acceptable. Western boots or moccasins are acceptable footwear. Westernstyle blue and black jeans are acceptable. Victorian Steampunk is also allowed.

SAFETY

One of our primary goals is to <u>educate as many people as</u> <u>possible in the safe and proper use of firearms.</u> Even though we use wax bullet ammunition, we treat them as they were live ammunition and observe all established range safety rules.


